

HARDIN COUNTY COMMUNITY ENDOWMENT FOUNDATION GRANT APPLICATION - 2010

Application deadline: February 3, 2010

For the fifth year, we are pleased to offer a **Hardin County Community Endowment Foundation** (HCCEF) Grant Application. This form seeks to make the application process simple and straight-forward for non-profits. Hard copies may be obtained at your local city hall, by contacting the Hardin County Extension Service at 641-648-4850, or you may download a copy from the Hardin County ISU Extension website at www.extension.iastate.edu/hardin/.

The **Hardin County Community Endowment Foundation** was formed in 2005 to provide philanthropic support for community betterment projects in Hardin County. The mission of the HCCEF is to foster private giving, to strengthen service providers, and to improve the quality of life for citizens throughout Hardin County.

HCCEF promotes endowment building, community grant making, organizational collaboration, and public leadership for the benefit of the Hardin County area. Foundation board members strive to assess community needs, develop assets, evaluate area grant applications, encourage partnerships, and initiate activities to enhance Hardin County.

Each year HCCEF makes grant awards in these seven areas of our mission:

**Arts & Culture *Community Betterment *Education *Health & Human Services
*Recreation & Environment *Youth Development
Economic Development/ Entrepreneurship/Leadership Training

The **Hardin County Community Endowment Foundation** makes grants to IRS 501(c)(3) tax exempt organizations, 170(b) units of government organizations, and/or other charitable groups to fulfill the Foundation's mission of supporting worthwhile, innovative projects and programs. Grant amounts are dependent upon the allocation of funds available to HCCEF each fiscal year.

- The maximum grant is \$10,000, not to exceed 50% of total project cost.
- Grant requests may be wholly or partially funded.
- We fund projects that address significant community issues; present innovative, creative, and practical proposals which build on community strengths; develop the leadership potential of the community; involve local people in the planning and implementation of the program; provide a plan for sustainability beyond the funding period; and promote capital projects that impact a significant number of county residents.

- Projects funded should not duplicate initiatives already undertaken by other non-profit agencies.
- We do not give multiple grants to the same organization in the same year or give grants to organizations with HCCEF grants not yet completed.
- We do not fund the same projects year after year; current operating expenses; annual and capital campaigns; budget deficits; reduction of debt; completed projects; endowments; individuals; religious purposes (this does not exclude grants to religious organizations for non-religious purposes). We also do not fund projects for memorials, statues, and plaques.
- If awarded a grant, the project must be completed within 9 months of receiving grant money, unless written permission for an extension has been allowed.
- Fifteen copies of your completed application must either be delivered to the Hardin County Auditor's Office at the courthouse in Eldora, or the Hardin County Extension Service Office in Iowa Falls by 4:00 p.m. on Monday, February 3, 2010 OR mailed to **Hardin County Community Endowment Foundation, Box 2, Eldora, IA 50627**, and postmarked no later than Monday, February 3.

**Applications submitted after the February 3rd deadline
will not be considered for this year's grant cycle.**

Grants will be reviewed based on the following criteria:

- benefit to residents in Hardin County -- with special attention given to projects that apply to a broad segment of the population
- the intrinsic merit of the project for meeting priority community needs
- number of residents who will be affected
- completeness of application -- with attention to clarity and measurability of the project's goals
- collaborative relationships
